#### **Ellingwood Chapel Concert Series Begins November 10th**

On November 10<sup>th</sup> a very special concert called "Music from Terezin: Art, Remembrance and Hope" will be performed by four members of the Boston Symphony playing as the Hawthorne String Quartet. The music to be played was composed in Terezin, a Nazi concentration camp located near Prague, under the most difficult circumstances imaginable. Terezin was used as a transit camp to Auschwitz and Treblinka and as a "show camp" for the International Red Cross and other visitors. When international visitors came to Terezin they saw a concert by prisoners, showing how humanely Jews were being treated.



#### The Nahant Dory Club News

Congratulations to Rex and Austin Antrim for again winning the Town Class National Championships held in early August on Spofford Lake near Keane, New Hampshire.

The event was run over a three day period and had one of the closest finishes in the recent history of the regatta. In seven races with one throw-out allowed, the Antrims finished with 18 points on the low point scoring system. They were followed by Marblehead's Peter Maitland, with 20 points and Tip O'Neil, 20.2. Rex and Austin had one first place finish, three seconds, a fifth and a sixth. Nick Strange from the Dory Club finished in eighth with 40 points and Pete Dickenson in twelfth place with 58. A total of twenty boats from Nahant, Marblehead, Touisset Point, RI and Spofford Lake participated. Next year's Nationals will be hosted by Marblehead, while Nahant will host the 2015 races which include a team race between the fleets for the Walsh Cup. Rumor has it that Rex was awarded a special award known as "The Drunken Sailor Award." Apparently it had been retired for several years but was revived to honor Rex. The other racers in order were Jeff Mayer Lynn, Ulf Westhoven Swampscott, Charles Schepens Nahant, Mike Doran Nahant, Arthur Ronan Lynn, Mark Patek Nahant, John Miranda Lynn, Greg Deterding Lynn and Dan Skrip Nahant. Next year Lynn will host the ninth regatta. Final racing results for all classes will be in the December issue.

Early in the season, the Club hosted author Michael Tougias who spoke about his latest book "A Storm too Soon." If you have not read it we suggest you do. Michael is becoming known in literary circles as the Stephen King of maritime horror stories. His next effort is about the loss of HMS Bounty during Hurricane Sandy and the rescue of twelve of fourteen members of her crew.

As in the past, the Nahant Lions Club, Garden Club, Women's Club, Council on Aging and Nahant Sailing Program used the clubhouse for various events. In addition the USCG Auxiliary conducted an educational program for young boaters between the ages of twelve and sixteen. Upon completion of the course and passing the examinations these young boaters were permitted to operate a power boat without an adult aboard.

The Nazis even made a film about the camp. None of the composers survived the camps. The Nazis thought they were destroying them for all time.

Even under the worst conditions an artist does not cease to be who he, or she, fundamentally is. Camp inmates had been discovered secretly performing concerts for other prisoners. Not only did performers perform, but composers wrote. Art is an expression of the human spirit that even the Nazis at their worst could not completely suppress. But artists must create and, thanks to Mark Ludwig, BSO violist and founder of the Terezin Music Foundation, this music survives. Had their lives not been cut short, these composers would have become heirs to Mendelssohn and Mahler, colleagues of Kurt Weill and Leonard Bernstein. Their music deserves to be heard.

I am happy to announce that our treasured Nahant artist, Norman Laliberte, has agreed to create a special work for this occasion.
