Take action and be prepared with Nahant's CodeRED Emergency Notification System

Disasters can strike without warning, forcing you to go without basic necessities for days. It's important that you think ahead and prepare for these disasters, to include flooding, tornadoes, hurricanes, snow storms, to name a few. We should be thinking about creating a basic emergency plan, in other words what to do and how to do it should a disaster strike. Prepare a disaster supply kit that is ready to go at a moment's notice. The family supply kit should include the following but not limited to, water, food, flashlights, spare batteries, battery powered radio, sleeping bag, prescription medications, personal identification, and a first aid kit. The following websites will prepare you more thoroughly for emergencies and disasters, www.fema.gov, www.redcross.org. Take the time today to prepare for a possible disaster tomorrow.

Now is the time to ensure you are enrolled to receive critical CodeRED emergency messages from Nahant Police Department during September's National Preparedness Month. Notifications are provided at no cost for all Nahant residents. Nahant officials will send out CodeRED alerts related to any potential storm activity, evacuations and shelter locations making it an essential preparedness tool to stay safe.

Those who have already enrolled to receive CodeRED alerts but have recently moved or changed telephone numbers are encouraged to visit the Nahant Police website at www.nahantpolice.org and click on the CodeRED logo to update their contact information.

"We need to be able to reach our community in case of an emergency. Be proactive and make sure we have your contact information in the CodeRED database so you can keep yourself, your family and your property protected in case of a real emergency.

During enrollment, citizens may customize if they would also like to receive general alerts in addition to emergency alerts and how they would like to receive them. Citizens are encouraged to save the telephone number 866-419-5000 in their telephone's contacts to easily identify when a CodeRED emergency alert is being delivered.

Those without Internet access may stop by the Nahant Police Department to register, or call 781-581-1212, Monday – Friday between the hours of 8:30 a.m. 3:30 p.m. to subscribe to receive CodeRED messages by supplying their information over the phone.

"Sometimes it takes a nationally recognized campaign like National Preparedness Month to get the word out about CodeRED. The Nahant Police Departments number one priority has always been to keep our citizens safe. The only way to do that is to get them better prepared and the best way to be prepared is to be informed using the CodeRED system.

Citizens are also encouraged to download the CodeRED Mobile Alert app to receive free location-specific emergency, general and missing person notifications sent by public safety officials as they travel to other CodeRED communities that represent all 50 states and Canada. Visit iTunes or Google Play to download the app.

Nahant has a big problem looming

As you probably know, the contractor (Pihl Inc.) which has been doing the work on the causeway has suddenly filed for bankruptcy and the project has come to a halt. As was reported in the Item last week, "The project's completion date has been set for Memorial Day weekend 2014."

Unfortunately, Nahant cannot wait that long because, just before the work stopped, they tore up a large amount of macadam and left it lying in piles, ripped out a section of wall which forms the base of the dune, and abandoned unsecured jersey barrier sections and other cement objects. When the winter storms arrive there is grave risk of the dune failing because of the loss of the wall which has supported its base for many years and serious risk of the loose cement structures being hurled out into the roadway by incoming waves. Last winter the power of the waves at our wharf pushed jersey barriers around like toys.

I have telephoned DCR Commissioner Jack Murray, Sen. Thomas McGee and Rep. Steve Walsh. I heard back from Steve Walsh's office and they promised to forward to me all updates from the DCR on the issue, which of course I will forward to you. I am waiting for returned calls from the other two.

What can you do? Telephone, write or email all three of the above men to express your concern. If they hear from lots of you they will take Nahant's welfare more seriously. Here is a sample text which you can adapt for your own use, or send your own wording:

"Dear _____,

As a resident of Nahant I am extremely concerned to learn that the causeway project has just been abandoned due to the bankruptcy of the contractor Pihl Inc. and is scheduled to be completed by Memorial Day 2014. When the winter storms arrive the integrity of the dune and the safety of the causeway are at risk due to removal of part of the wall which supports the dune, abandonment of jersey barriers and other large cement objects, and dumping of piles of excavated macadam roadway.

Before the winter storms arrive, I urge you to find a way to correct this dangerous situation where the dune and the debris could be washed over the causeway, cutting Nahant off from the mainland and causing a dangerous situation."

This is a moment when we Nahanters can make a difference.
