Winter Parking Ban

The winter parking ban for all residents will be in effect December 22, 2011, through March 20, 2012, from midnight to 6:00 a.m. No on-street parking will be allowed.

Residents may apply in person for an on-street parking waiver at the Nahant police station. The fee is \$30 and is non-refundable, if the police deny the waiver.

In the event of a snow emergency, all cars must be removed from the street, including those with a parking waiver, or they will be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense.



The Spirit of Christmas Past: Four Centuries of Christmas in New England

The Nahant Historical Society cordially invites you to celebrate the season by attending the Paterson Lecture - The Spirit of Christmas Past: Four Centuries of Christmas in New England by Kenneth C. Turino, Manager of Community Engagement and Exhibitions at Historic New England on Sunday, December 4th at 2:00 pm in the Serenity Room at the Nahant Community Center at 41 Valley Road.

Come and enjoy this well-illustrated presentation that traces the development of the celebration of Christmas from the time it was outlawed in 17th century New England into the 20th century, showing how the trappings of modern Christmas came into being. Learn how Christmas was transformed from a rowdy celebration to a family centered holiday, for many the most important of the year. Nahant, as has many communities, developed its unique traditions.

The Paterson Lecture is a yearly event in memory of the Society's late president, historian and author Stanley C. Paterson.

Our 2011 guest lecturer is Kenneth C. Turino, Manager of Community Engagement and Exhibitions at Historic New England, the oldest, largest and most comprehensive regional heritage organization in the country. Turino has overseen Historic New England's centennial celebrations in 2010, plus a steady and inspired expansion of its events and courses overall. Among them is the annual Program in New England Studies, an intensive one week study of New England material culture. He is also responsible for Historic New England's traveling exhibitions program. Previously Turino was Executive Director of the Lynn Museum and Historical Society. He has worked at many historic houses including the Paul Revere House in Boston and is currently a Trustee of the Fogg Rollins House in Exeter, New Hampshire. Moreover, Turino is Chairman of the American Association for State and Local History's Leadership in History Awards Program and a member of its' Historic House Committee. He holds a Masters of Arts in Teaching and Museum Education from George Washington University and is an adjunct professor in the Tufts University Museum Studies Program where he teaches courses in exhibition planning and historic house museums.

The Society has twice collaborated with Turino and his graduate students on major exhibitions: Enlisting a Nation (2004) and Drawn to Nahant (2008). In addition, this multi-talented Nahanter has published several articles on the history of Christmas and co-authored Nahant in the Arcadia Publishing series Images of America with Society board member Christopher Mathias.

This program is free and open to the public. As parking is limited at the Community Center, a shuttle van service will be available from St. Thomas Aquinas church parking lot at 248 Nahant Road between 1:30 and 4:30 pm. Light refreshments will be served.

Q & A with North Shore Physical Therapy

Q. I get nervous when walking on outdoor surfaces and this prevents me from going different places, because I feel unsafe and I am afraid that I might fall.

A. You may be having a problem with balance while walking and this has made you fearful of walking on uneven surfaces. Several factors could affect your balance. If you take different medications that may alter how you feel, you should discuss this with your physician. You could have decreased sensation in your feet from diabetes. You could have leg tightness or weakness of the hips, knees, or calves which make you walk differently and make you feel unsteady on your feet. Just the fear of falling down may also be a factor which prevents you from having enough confidence to venture onto different types of surfaces. North Shore Physical Therapy Associates offers free balance screens to anyone in the community. During the balance screen an assessment of your strength, flexibility, balance and walking speed will determine if you would benefit from home exercises, supervised physical therapy or just using a cane to assist your balance. By calling our offices you may be seen by a physical therapist for a free falls risk assessment. Please call our offices Marblehead/Swampscott (781-631-82500, Salem (978-910-0486) to schedule an appointment or talk with a physical therapist that will help you determine if you need physical therapy.





Facts To Stay Fit

ADHD (attention deficit hyperactivity disorder), sometimes called ADD (attention deficit disorder), is linked with hyperactivity, impulsive behavior and attention problems, in both children and adults. It's estimated that up to 12 percent of school-aged children and 6 percent of adults have ADHD, making it harder for them to focus on tasks, manage their time, control their behavior, or even sit still.

There is no single test to diagnose ADD/ADHD. To reach a diagnosis, a doctor, or specialist, may do a physical exam to rule out any physical problems, as well as ask questions about behavior in certain situations.

Treatment is often a combination of medication and behavioral therapy. The goals of treatment are to help the person control impulsive behaviors, do better in school, or work and improve social relationships. Be well.

From My Perspective . . . By Michael P. Manning, Selectman

Once upon a time there was an enterprising, parent-fostered, pre-kindergarten, day-care organization that thrived in a corner of the Johnson School called Periwinkle Preschool Inc. The organization was born from the aspirations of parents and enabled by the thoughtful discussions and affirmative Town vote of an entire community. The parents aspired for a nurturing day-care environment where their children could learn, stimulate each others' imagination and interact in a dynamic, supervised social setting. The parents were willing, not only to chip in the money to cover compensation for staff, supplies and scholarships for needy students, but also looking forward to being active, participating volunteers in the operation and to schedule their personal time commitments and were looking for appropriate space to get



started. They incorporated a non-profit collaborative to move forward. The Town had extra space in a wing of the Johnson School that contained two classrooms that were designed for middle, or high school shop operations, but unused and in disrepair. The Town, after wide-ranging discussion at Town Meeting, about all aspects of having such an organization under the roof of its elementary school, voted a sum of money to rehab the raw space to allow such an enterprise to move in. The School Committee was left to make a satisfactory arrangement to provide the space to the parent-run and directed enterprise. The non-profit further improved the raw classroom space at their own expense. The operation flourished for many years, educating a total of 50 full and part-time pre-K students a year, as an independent, self-sustaining organization. They also provided \$20,000 in revenue to the school, in lieu of rent, for providing heat, lights and space. Many of us are grateful parents and grandparents and citizen sponsors and our children are alumni of this community inspired enterprise.

The renovation of the Johnson School saw many improvements to enable the building to serve into the future. While there was a reduction in the total floor space in the school, as was appropriate for the current and future enrollment, the renovation committee had wisely included space sufficient to maintain the preschool operation. There were numerous changes in the management personnel of the school during the same period in the School Committee, as well as the Superintendent and the Principal. At one point the school administration decided to change the status quo and to take over the entire preschool operation. The parents were thanked for their prior involvement, teachers and staff were hired, and the renovated Johnson School moved on without much notice. There was no discussion at Town Meeting; there was no budget discussion about how this transition would be funded.

At the last Town Meeting, as we discussed the need for an override to fund school operations, a former director of Periwinkle Preschool Inc. asked the Superintendent if the current preschool operation was still providing a net benefit to the school operation of \$20,000, or more. The Superintendent had not experienced the prior operation and only offered that the "present payments from the parents covered the costs of the staff." A rather simple programmatic look at the transitions would indicate that the Town should feel diminished for several reasons:

No one is paying the Schools \$20,000 for the privilege of inspiring our pre-K students. A volunteer organization of interested parents has been lost.

Overall costs have risen as parent volunteerism decreased and charitable donations and sweat equity have been lost.

Is the current status quo the best operating organization for our overall educational enterprise? Will this be a result of a community discussion?



DECEMBER all ready! This month, I want to share with you, some information about safety, health and well-being, and of course, what the COA has planned for this Christmas season.

When it comes to safety for seniors, the Essex County TRIAD is where we turn. Nahant will enter into a partnership with the Essex County Sheriff's office, the Essex County DA's office, police and fire and, most importantly, the seniors of Nahant. The TRIAD brings seniors and law enforcement work together to "empower, educate and improve the safety, security and peace of mind, of the senior population."

The Nahant TRIAD held an organizational meeting in October. The committee was formed and officers were elected. The following are our volunteer representatives from the town, Linda Lehman, Chairperson, Susan Bonner, Vice-Chairperson, Diane Desmond, secretary, and members-at-large, Gertrud Joyce, Jeannette White, Edwin Peterson III, Mary Ann Putnam, Robert Branga and Linda Peterson.

The first event sponsored by the Nahant TRIAD will be held on Tuesday, December 6th, at 1:00 p.m., in the Tiffany Room at the Senior Center. This event is important since all the necessary parties will be here for the signing of the Nahant TRIAD's by-laws. In attendance, will be representatives from the Sheriff's department, DA's office, Police Chief, Robert Dwyer, Fire Chief, Ed Hyde and the TRIAD committee. Please join this event to get a better understanding of what TRIAD can do for you. This program is truly committed to helping seniors understand safety threats in the 21st century.

Our Tai Chi program has gotten off to a great start. Many regulars are already reaping the benefits of this martial art. Open to all abilities. No prior experience necessary. Each week we re-experience the essential ingredients of Tai Chi and then incorporate that essence into a simple set of therapeutic movements.

Tai Chi Chuan, commonly called Tai Chi or Taiji, is an exercise that employs slow intentional movements, coordinated with breathing and imagery, to strengthen and relax the physical body and mind and improve health. It is especially effective for people facing physical challenges and has been shown in a number of medical studies to be beneficial and safe for a wide range of populations.

Evidenced-Based Benefits of Tai Chi Chuan include: Balance, Strength and Flexibility, Cardio-respiratory function, Immune Function, Emotional Well-being, Quality of Life and Self-Efficacy.

Our instructor, Regina Gibbons M.Ac., a Licensed Acupuncturist, has been studying and practicing Tai Chi and Chi Kung for over a decade. She continues to train under the guidance of Peter Wayne, Ph.D., a nationally-recognized Tai Chi researcher. She has served as a Tai Chi Instructor in Harvard Medical School-based, NIH-funded trials, evaluating Tai Chi for Chronic Heart Failure, for Osteopenia and for Elderly populations. Regina will be changing the day and time of her class starting on January 9, 2012. The new day is Monday, the new time is 12:30, same location.


